Experiential Period

Impromptu treatments, getting ready for licensing exam and oral panels.

After someone has completed a spiritual mind treatment, the class gently and constructively gives feedback. We are watching for things that the exam and panels will be looking for, like clearly defined steps. The intention is to do this often enough within the next few weeks that treating aloud with others listening with intention becomes second nature. We embrace the process and the feedback, knowing it gets us (and our classmates) ready for the final stages of licensing.

- Give this scenario:
 - My back has been bothering me for two weeks. I don't have health insurance and don't want to go to the doctor. I want prayer for healing.
 - Sit until someone feels called to pray.
- Give this scenario:
 - Richard is a gay man who has just found out he's HIV positive. He's afraid of dying and wants you to heal him.
- Give this scenario:

- John is Richard's partner. He wants you to pray for Richard's healing.
- Give this scenario:
 - Melissa is pregnant. She's a teenager and is thinking about an abortion. Her family is against it. She wants help with a decision.
- Give this scenario:
 - When Joan is stressed she shops to make herself feel better. Her credit cards are maxed out and her husband is threatening to leave.
 - Sit until someone feels called to do a treatment for Joan.
- Give this scenario:
 - Mike is alcoholic. He's been in AA but recently began drinking again. His wife Marge comes to you, at the end of her rope. She asks for treatment for Mike to overcome his alcoholic binges and begin AA again.
- Give this scenario:
 - Paul comes to you, concerned about his relationship with his girlfriend, who is suffering from depression. He asks that you pray for her freedom from depression.
